The last song he wrote – The Redemption Song – was performed for the first time to his wife Rita, the force in his life. After hearing it she asked, "When did you write that". He replied – "Last night". She paused, thought about it, and then turned to him and said, "You are ready". You are ready....

I was a mess. The dam opened and I burst into a flood of tears. Those three words carried so much weight, held such a deep sense of 'knowing' and gave support to him at many levels. She had also just 'let go of him' herself. These are the things we know and do when we love someone - the freedom that we impart to 'be' and 'become' at will throughout our time together - the strength to let go when it is best - affording them the privacy and space they need to process their own thoughts about mortality in their own time. The Redemption Song was in essence his goodbye song, and she knew it.... because she knew him.


Rita, Bob Marley's wife, was and remains a force beyond measure for his dedication toward societal change in daily perseverance, in the embodiment of Jamaican culture, by his art, within his heart, and in his creativity. Of the two of them, I see in Rita as the symbol for two approaches to life relationships, one tinged with conventionalism, and one based in metaphysics.

Conventionally, she buoyed him, made a home around family, wrote music, and fought with him. Not one of these aspects was without passion.

Metaphysically, she knew who he was at the soul level. She knew his needs, struggles, passions, and urges. She also knew that she could not sever the gift of connection with him that was bestowed by Spirit.

Rita's words 'You are ready' brought a culmination of knowing, seeing, and communing with a soul that would probably never realize the depth of their connection but at the same time needed and cherished it. Space was necessary for these two souls and space happened, yet respect always remained. Other relationships happened, yet respect remained. Fighting happened, yet respect remained. Hardships abounded and this enhanced respect. Separation from

It is that strength that sustains, sets the example, and bolsters the family at all levels, within and around other people's lives. The strength these two souls were able to put toward peace, both individually and worldly came from within themselves. Their common goal was to create peace within and share it with the world.

It is difficult to smother the flame of light and love emitted by these two and it shines today. After Bob's untimely death at 36, in 1981, Rita has continued to bring both legacies forward. Their music continues to be used to instill heart-centeredness in people, communities, and nations.

Accomplishments by Rita Marley:

Mrs. Rita Marley's musical career has seen the production of four successful albums: Who feels It Knows it, Harambe, the 1992 GRAMMY nominated album We Must Carry On, and Spectacle For Tribuffalos, as well as the classic reggae album Beginning, with the I-Threes. In 1996 the Jamaican government awarded her the Order of Distinction (OD) for her outstanding works and accomplishments, which are numerous. In 2004, Mrs. Rita Marley was awarded Personality of the Year in Ghana in recognition of her work through the Rita Marley Foundation. In November 2011 Mrs. Rita Marley O.D was awarded the prestigious Honorable Marcus Garvey Lifetime Achievement Award at the Caribbean American Heritage Awards in recognition of her outstanding contributions. Mrs. Rita Marley O.D was bestowed the Living Legends Awards at the 2012 African International Media Summit (AIMS) in Malawi. The International Women's Forum honored Mrs. Rita Marley O.D in May 2012 with the Leading Light Award for h er work in music and charity. In August 2013 Mrs. Rita Marley O.D. received an honorary Ghanaian citizenship from the government of Ghana, West Africa for her philanthropic work with assisting the poor and needy.

Founded and runs the Bob Marley Foundation which is committed to helping those in need.

1994: Inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame
